PROGRAM INFORMATION

The Funeral Service education associate-degree Program at American River College is accredited by the American Board of Funeral Service Education (ABFSE), 992 Mantua Pike, Suite 108 Woodbury Heights, NJ 08097 (816) 233-3747 Web: https://abfse.org. The program consists of a combination of general education and funeral service education courses with related laboratory experience. Successful completion of the program qualifies the student to take the National and California Board Examination to become a licensed embalmer. In order for a student to graduate from the Funeral Service Education Program, the student must maintain a grade of "C" or better in all coursework including general education courses and successfully register for the National Board Examination. The student is responsible for providing professional attire uniform, laboratory fees, necessary equipment, and transportation to off-campus laboratory locations. Program costs are approximately \$3,000. School fees are additional. All costs/fees are subject to change.

PRIMARY OBJECTIVES OF THIS PROGRAM

Upon completion of this program, the student will be able to:

- explain the importance of funeral service professionals in developing relationships with the families and communities they serve.
- identify standards of ethical conduct in funeral service practice.
- interpret how federal, state, and local laws apply to funeral service in order to ensure compliance.
- apply principles of public health and safety in the handling and preparation of human remains.
- demonstrate technical skills in embalming and restorative art that are necessary for the preparation and handling of human remains.
- demonstrate skills required for conducting arrangement conferences, visitations, services, and ceremonies.
- describe the requirements and procedures for burial, cremation, and other accepted forms of final disposition of human remains.
- describe methods to address the grief-related needs of the bereaved.
- explain management skills associated with operating a funeral establishment.
- demonstrate verbal and written communication skills and research skills needed for funeral service practice.

GOALS OF THE FUNERAL SERVICE EDUCATION PROGRAM

As an accredited mortuary college our program goals and objectives are as follows:

- To prepare students to be members of a human services profession
- To prepare students to be members of the community in which they serve
- To be participants in the relationship between bereaved families and those engaged in the funeral services profession.
- To offer professional knowledge of and compliance with federal, state provincial/territorial, and local regulatory guidelines
- To be sensitive to the responsibility for public health, safety and welfare in caring for human remains

REQUIREMENTS FOR ENROLLMENT TO THE PROGRAM

- 1. Graduation from an accredited high school in the United States or successful completion of General Education Development (GED) or California High School Proficiency Exam (CHSPE) prior to time of application: (Transcript must be an **official** transcript in a **sealed envelope** from the institution that issued the diploma. High school Transcripts must be included with the application packet.
 - **a.** Students with a high school diploma from a school outside the United States must have transcripts evaluated by a National Association of Credential Evaluation Services (NACES) approved independent agency. Such cases will be evaluated on an individual basis.
 - b. Students who possess an Associate of Arts/Associate of Science degree or higher from a regionally accredited college are exempt from the educational requirement stated above. <u>Official transcripts from colleges outside of the Los Rios District should be sent to ARC Admissions and Records or brought to the ARC Counselor during the counseling appointment. Please include with your application.</u>
 - C. Students who have attended college outside the United States must have transcripts evaluated by a NACES approved independent agency, demonstrating equivalency to an AA/AS degree or higher from
 U.S. regionally accredited college. Such cases will be evaluated on an individual basis.
- 2. A cumulative college GPA of 2.0 and a grade of "C" or better in the program prerequisites: BIOL 102 or BIOL 103 and FSE 300 and completion of all other General Education graduation requirements. The FSE program will allow grades in-progress during the application period.
- 3. First-time applicants should meet with an ARC counselor to obtain a Curriculum Planning Summary sheet and document completion of all eligibility requirements. Call (916) 484-8572 for an appointment

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS AND ENROLLMENT APPLICATION PROCESS

All items in the enrollment application process are extremely important. Students who omit any part of the required information will not be considered for admission to the Funeral Service Education program.

- 1. Students who are interested in applying for the Funeral Service Education program should begin preparing and planning ahead by requesting and/or compiling the support documents in Item 4 below to be evaluated and included in the pre-enrollment application. This process may take several weeks.
- 2. High school transcript, GED Scores, CHSPE Certificate of Proficiency, proof of AA/AS degree or higher, or NACES equivalent evaluation. Transcript must be an **official** transcript in a **sealed envelope** from the institution that issued the diploma. High school Transcripts must be included with the application packet.
- 3. Students must call the ARC Counseling department at (916) 484-8572 no *later than Friday, November 8, 2024* to schedule an appointment to obtain a Curriculum Planning Summary Sheet. <u>Do not wait until the last minute as appointments can be very difficult to schedule during peak times.</u>
- 4. **Student Checklist**: The following documents must be brought to the counseling appointment:
 - A. Grade Verification: If you are currently taking a prerequisite for the Funeral Service Education program, it is your responsibility to submit an unofficial transcript highlighting prerequisite courses successfully completed during the fall semester by *Friday January 3, 2025*. The FSE program will allow grades inprogress.
 - B. All regionally accredited college transcripts, regardless of applicability to funeral service requirements:
 - i. Unofficial transcripts from the Los Rios Community College District (ARC, SCC, CRC, FLC).
 - ii. Official (sealed) transcripts from schools outside the Los Rios Community College District.
 - iii. **NOTE**: All transcripts must accompany your application; do not have them mailed separately to Admissions & Records, Health and Education Division, or the Counseling department.
 - iV. Copies of course descriptions of FSE major courses completed outside the Los Rios Community College District for evaluation of equivalency. *Descriptions must come from the specific catalog year in which the course was taken.*
 - V. Completed enrollment application form signed by applicant
- 5. At your appointment, the counselor will complete an ARC Curriculum Planning Summary Sheet. This must be done within the semester in which you are submitting the enrollment packet. An **updated** ARC Curriculum Planning Summary Sheet is required when resubmitting a program application.
- 6. Submit **complete** packet and supporting documentation to the Health and Education Division office. (See "Student Checklist" on enrollment Application for details).

Application Deadline: *Wednesday,, November 27, 2024*, by 4pm –. Mailed applications must be received by the Funeral Service Department by the due date noted on the application. Applications lost or misdirected in the mail are not the responsibility of the Funeral Service department.

ACCEPTANCE TO THE PROGRAM

Selection is based on a computerized random selection process from among the qualified applicants. *Only applicants* who meet the educational and pre-enrollment requirements and follow the pre-enrollment procedure will be considered for the program. Meeting all these requirements does not guarantee acceptance into the program.

Once accepted to the Funeral Service Program, students, <u>MUST</u> attend a Mandatory New Student Orientation, and at their own expense, must provide the following at the beginning of the semester:

- a. Health History & Report of Medical Examination with required inoculations. Instructions will be included in with your acceptance letter.
- b. Drug screening test (required by clinical facilities). Instructions will be included in with your acceptance letter.
- c. Proof of malpractice Insurance (malpractice insurance is not refundable). Instructions will be included in with your acceptance letter.
- d. Background check (required by clinical facilities). Instructions will be included in with your acceptance letter.
 - (* Information regarding a, b, c, and d will be provided at orientation)
