

ARC Nursing Program Frequently Asked Questions

1. Does ARC have recency requirements for prerequisites? Are students penalized for repeating prerequisite courses?

There is no recency requirement for Nursing Program prerequisites, nor do they expire. ARC does not discount for repeated courses – the highest grade will be taken.

2. When is the nursing application open?

The application is available in February and September – see website for specific dates each year.

3. What are the costs for the Nursing Program?

Costs are approximate and subject to change. Below is a guide for students to anticipate costs when entering the Nursing Program. **Approximate Total Program Cost**: \$7400.00.

6. Can I apply to the Nursing Program if I have a criminal/conviction history?

Students must complete a background check upon entry to the program and a fingerprinting upon application for licensure at the end of the program.

- 1. <u>Initial Background Check</u> this is an employment level background check and is required by our clinical partners for entry into medical facilities. Students with a criminal background may not be allowed to attend a clinical facility. If a student is not allowed into a facility, he/she will not be able to meet the objectives of the Nursing Program and will be ineligible for enrollment.
- 2. <u>Fingerprinting for Licensure Application</u> In accordance with the California Board of Registered Nursing, a person convicted of any offense other than a minor traffic violation may not qualify to be licensed as a nurse. All convictions must be reported at the time of application. Please see the BRN website for more information: http://rn.ca.gov/enforcement/convictions
