

Continuing Professional Training for Peace Officers (Perishable Skills)

COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course is designed to meet the 2-year perishable skills training cycle requirements for (active) California peace officers. Course content consists of instructional blocks which update and advance the student's existing knowledge and skill set associated with providing public safety in fluid and dynamic multicultural communities. Instruction includes strategic communication, first aid/CPR/AED update, tactical firearms, arrest and control, and may include additional topics determined by legislative mandates and/or regional needs.

This course is designed to provide practical hands-on training in police tactics and weapon usage. Participants in this course will engage in physically demanding classroom training exercises that include a risk of injury. Students must complete all 24-hours of the course (all blocks of instruction) in order to pass the course. Upon completion of the course, students will receive an ARC SRPSTC Certificate of Completion. Formerly SCSD1150. Pass/No Pass only.

Effective 11/7/24: for safety purposes neither students nor instructors are allowed to bring or use the Sig Sauer P320 at the JPA range.

ENROLLMENT

To register: Everyone must complete a Course Reservation & Payment Form and either fax (916) 570-5023 or scan/email it to this office at srpstc@arc.losrios.edu. Students are also required to complete the mandatory college enrollment process* prior to the first day of class.

Students must 1) Be free of felony convictions; 2) possess a valid California Driver's License; 3) undergo a fingerprint and criminal history check; 4) be a minimum of 18 years of age; 5) be a United States high school graduate; pass the GED, pass the California High School Proficiency Examination, or have attained a two-year or four-year degree from an accredited college or university; and 6) complete a medical suitability examination.
