85% of students agree that studying abroad was the most <u>meaningful</u> experience of their undergraduate education.






# Why London?






## AIFS Student Center

- London is our classroom!




# British Life & Culture Course

# Housing

### Homestays

- Twin rooms in local homestays (Zone 3 or 4 approx. 45-60-minute commute)
- Continental breakfast (toast, cereal, coffee or tea) included daily. Shared kitchen, living space & laundry facilities
- Wi-Fi enabled
- Included in program fee

## **Student Residence**

- Twin bedrooms in a residence in central zone 2- approx. 45-minute commute
- Equipped kitchenettes & ensuite bathroom, shared study area & laundry facilities in building
- Wi-Fi enabled
- No meals are included
- Supplemental fee \$1755



## **Transportation Pass**

A transportation pass or "Oyster Card" will be provided to students for use on buses & underground in zones 1-3 or 4 (homestay students) or zones 1-2 (residence students) for the duration of the program
